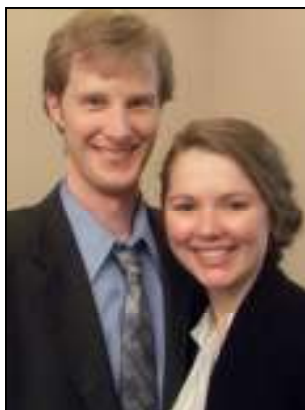

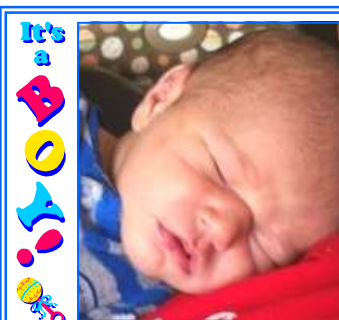

# CAMPUS MINISTRY

When I was asked to write this article about the Knaups and the Campus Ministry, the first thing that came to my mind was when we first became friends with Tim and Kim.

They came to the Lord in 1985, and right away Tim and Tom (my husband) hit it off. They would meet to shoot buckets, but it was debatable who hit the most baskets. Soon we became like family. They were put in the leadership position for the Campus Ministry in 1986 and have always taken the responsibility of that position very seriously.

When Kim neared the birth of her first child, I asked who would be watching the baby while they had their campus meetings. She said that she didn't know, so I volunteered, and it worked out great for both of us. God knew! So in 1990, Tom and I became part of the Campus Ministry and have been ever since.

The Badger Chapter of CMI (College Ministries International) reaches out to campus students in small group meetings, weekly Bible studies, surveying, College Church services on campus, prayer meet-

ings, and attending services at Calvary Gospel Church.

You don't have to be students to contribute to the Campus Ministry. We were blessed to be able to have fellowships at our house. From bonfires to hosting the annual Christmas party for many years, that was a real blessing, because we would have students tell us how thankful they were to come to a home for the holiday when they couldn't go to their own home.

CMI has monthly outings such as cookouts, hiking at Devils Lake State Park, marshmallow roasts at Picnic Point on the UW campus, potluck at local homes of members, caroling at the UW Hospital, and other recreational events. They arrange transportation to these events for those students who do not have their own.

Campus Ministry has worldwide impact. The students they reach become "missionaries," taking the message of salvation all over the country and even to other countries. Tim is like a pastor to these students and may be even more. The Knaups

are on call 24/7, and they treat their students like family. It doesn't matter what kind of weather it is or what time of day it is, if there is a need, they are there. I have the utmost respect and admiration for them.

Fifteen guys came over to the Knaup house where the draft took place. Tony Shepherd and Pierre Price picked the teams, and we were off to the field.

Tony's team got off to a good start. Dave Badger picked off a pass and ran it back for a touchdown. Some of the other highlights included a long touchdown catch by Michell Pena and an improbable touchdown on a tipped pass. Tony's team won the first game

After the first game, we switched up teams a little so we could play with some of the other guys. The game was back and forth throughout with Tony's team holding the edge the entire way. We traded off touchdowns throughout and with just a few minutes remaining the team consisting of Peter Saindon, Eric Siedl, Ben Thompson, and others were driving down the field and looking to close the gap, which then stood at 10 points.

Late in the second game, Peter's team completed a pass that got us within just a couple yards of the end zone. After an incompletion on the next play, we saw Bro. Thompson on the ground. He was having a seizure. That is when football abruptly ended and life came back into focus.

Madison police officer and CGC member, Jason Johnson, swept in to take control of the situation. He along with Peter Saindon kept him on his side and stabilized his head. Jason realized that Bro. Thompson wasn't responding. He

had no pulse. Jason started doing CCR (chest compressions) while Peter held his head. We yelled over to the sideline to call for an ambulance. The next roughly 25 minutes were really tough. The paramedics were on their way and we were doing everything we could for Ben.

While Jason and Peter were switching off CCR, the rest of us bound together in prayer for Bro. Thompson. A One-Call had gone out, and within minutes, the entire church was aware of the situation. Prayers were going out all over the city for our brother. The only thing we could do is pray. It was in God's hands.

The paramedics arrived and took over working on Ben, who at this point was pale. The EMTs shocked him, and when he was going into the ambulance, the last we heard was that he was going in and out of consciousness.

The police that were there said that the actions of Jason and Peter saved his life.

Though what they did was truly heroic and needed to be done, it was God that saved Bro. Thompson that day.

I remember calling my mother and telling her what had happened. At the end of the conversation, I said, "We gave him a chance. It is in God's hands now." Looking back on that day, we won't remember the football, fellowship, or food. We will all remember the day God performed a miracle and gave a man another chance at life. When all hope seemed to be lost, God stepped in. This all reminds me of Proverbs 3:5, "Trust in the Lord with all thine heart and lean not on thine own understanding."

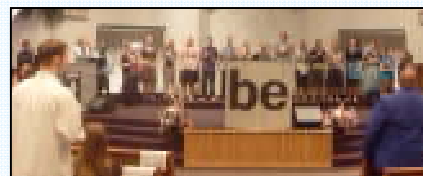
5. Support: We can support our

A special Back-to-School weekend was held September 25 and 26

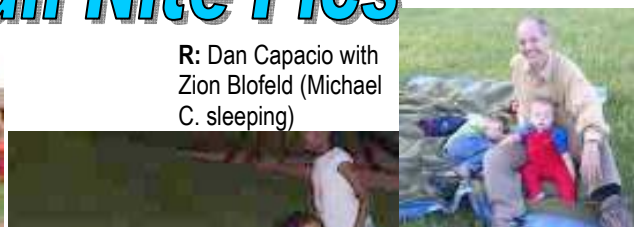
with an emphasis on children. The weekend included a children's choir led by Scotia Leonardson and a Bible drama produced by Tim and Kayla Powell.

**Guess what? Satan doesn't want you to be soul winner! He doesn't want you to be a Christian either.** In his eyes, if you have to be a Christian, he would prefer you to be one in name only. Satan has made it his goal, if possible, to make each and every one of us ineffective.

Satan uses a large number of tactics, devices, and people to get the job done. One of Satan's greatest and most powerful tools is his ability to intimidate. The dictionary renders the word "intimidate" to mean (1) to make afraid; to make timid; overawe; (2) to force or deter with threats or violence.

The Bible is full of examples of people who were subjected to the full fury of Satan to try to stop them from being a witness to God's salvation. The apostle, Paul, was often subjected to physical abuse at the hands of Satan's minions (see II Corinthians 11:23-28). Even today around the world, people are still being imprisoned, abused, ridiculed, and sidelined because of their willingness to be used by God to be witnesses.

Intimidation takes many forms. From the severest of physical abuse, like the examples listed above, to the more subtle manifestations, such as threat of termination or disassociation from a job or group. Almost all employers have employee handbooks which forbid all of the types of behavior they want eliminated from the workplace. Now this may be one of solicitation.

The company I work for has a handbook that reads: "It is the Company's policy that there be no solici-

tion during working time. No employee may engage in solicitation, nor may any employee willingly accept solicitation on behalf of any club, society, and religious organization, political party or similar association for any other purpose during actual working time of either the solicitor or the person being solicited."

It goes on to say there may not be any solicitation during "actual working time." It defines actual working time as not being before actual work time begins, the time after the working day ends, and not during the employees break or lunch time. Thus, my company's employee handbook lets me know I can legally witness at certain times of the day. We owe our employers a full workday.

Intimidation takes place on all levels, in all manner of ways and methods. Christianity is under fire at all levels of society all around the world. Intimidation has many faces: outright rejection or hostility, mockery, threats (real or imagined), attitudes displayed against or about us, snickering within one's peer group, snubbing, and disassociation from families. The list seems endless and intimidating in itself. Almost always, intimidation is based in the ignorance of the people who are the intimidators.

Intimidation is always a discouraging thing to endure, that's why Satan uses it. Sometimes it seems like a hopeless and overwhelming prospect to carry out the mission of the Church-to reach the lost for the Kingdom of God.

Jesus said in John 16:33, "These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world

ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." Paul said in Romans 8:18, "For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us."

So what can we do to overcome a spirit of intimidation? Prayer is first and foremost. Prayer is a powerful tool in our arsenal of weapons. Pray that God will give you a spirit of boldness (see Acts 4:29). Pray for wisdom (see James 1:5). Pray you may take on the whole armor of God, particularly the shield of faith (see Ephesians 6: 11-13). Pray God will lead you to those who are hungry to know Him.

Secondly, we need to study the Word of God, so we know what we are talking about. Calvary Gospel Church's Home Bible Study team would like to offer some help in this area.
