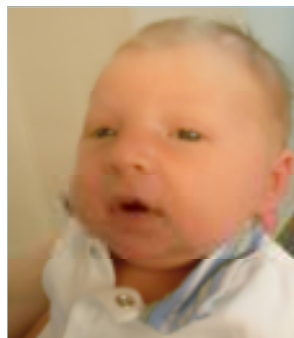
Amara La'Nae George arrived on August 6 weighing 7 lbs. 8 oz.

JUNIOR BIBLE QUIZZING NATIONAL COMPETITION

The day was hot and sticky, but hopes were high and the future bright as we traveled southwest to St. Louis, Missouri, for Junior Bible Quizzing Nationals. The tournament was held at the plush Renaissance Hotel from July 26 through July 30.

It's hard to describe how it feels to pull up to the tournament hotel and see families, coaches, and kids from all over the nation who have also quizzed, quizzed, and practiced all year long to earn a place at the National Junior Bible Quizzing tournament. This year, there were 65 experienced teams and 40 beginner teams from as far away as Metro New York, California, and Oregon.

akowski were our qualifying quizzers in the experienced division. These two are veteran Nationals participants, appearing in their third national tourney. Cassie Zimmerman, Margaret Ackah, and Clayton Czerniakowski also qualified for the tournament in the beginner division. For these three, Nationals would be a brand new experience.

The draw happened around noon on Monday. At this time, the teams are randomly matched and the schedule set for the remainder of the days of the tournament. Some teams quiz on Monday and some don't quiz until Tuesday. All teams must lose two times to be out of the tournament.

Our beginner team was up to quiz pretty quickly. Their first opponent was a team from Oklahoma. We did not win that quiz, but Clayton was the second high scorer and also got a

silver medal for scoring more than 70 points. Margaret assisted by scoring 10 points.

Our Experienced team quizzed Tuesday for the first time against a team from Napa Valley, California. They experienced a disappointing loss, and we were finished for the day.

Both of our teams started in the losers' bracket on Wednesday. Our Experienced team won quizzes against teams from North Carolina and Texas. That finished out our day on Wednesday. On Thursday, our team would be up against a team from Kansas that won second place at Nationals last year. I'm thinking there was a fair amount of prayer taking place in our room that night!

Back to our beginner team...their quiz on Wednesday was against a team from Tennessee. Another loss

C.A.R.E. Ministry

The purpose statement of Calvary Gospel Church (CGC) is:

The CARE ministry is the tool used at CGC for “reaching in.” This ministry implements the “Jesus method” of people mentoring other people, helping those new in the faith to mature and eventually become mentors themselves, enabling the church to remain a “family” even through tremendous growth. Mentoring is discipleship. This ministry enables us to disciple the large numbers of people who are coming to the Lord and whose numbers will be increasing as revival continues.

CARE partners are like extra arms of the pastors to care, extra eyes to know the needs, and extra lips to share Godly advice regarding Christian growth. CARE partners share prayer needs, victory reports, and the progress of those in their group with members of the pastoral staff. This enables our pastoral staff to effectively minister to many more people than they could personally.

CARE partners also try to connect every new member with others in the congregation so that they quickly feel they are part of the “family” of God at CGC. New members can feel free to share their needs with their CARE partners and know that the pastoral staff will be made aware, confidentially, of their needs. Did you know your pastors WANT to know when you are ill, in the hospital, lose a loved one, lose your job, etc.? They care, and will always hold you up in prayer and help in any way they can. The CARE partners help them to know these needs. Our pastors also want to rejoice with you when God answers prayer or meets a need.

To be a CARE partner, one must be born again of the water and the Spirit, be actively involved in growth through the New Life classes, attend all services regularly, be actively pursuing the mind of Christ for their own lives, have God’s heart for His sheep, be discreet and friendly, and have convenient access to the internet (because communication with the pastoral staff is accomplished online using Connection Power. This ministry is a work in progress. We are currently using a database called “Connection Power” to connect the CARE partners and the pastoral staff.)

SENIOR BIBLE QUIZZING NATIONAL COMPETITION By Stephanie Zimmerman

Another quiz year has come and gone. Many hours have been spent studying God's Word, memorizing it, and putting it into action (well at least the action of buzzing in, interrupting questions, and answering with the Word of God). For the first time in seven years, Madison has had a quizzer finish the year at the Senior level. Jacob Zimmerman was this individual and successfully memorized 417 verses. Since he didn't have a teammate here, he joined the team from Racine, and they continued on to Nationals, which was held in St. Louis this year.



Competition at Senior Nationals is very intense. Not only is there more material to mentally sort through, the questions are more complex than at the Junior level. As this was Jacob's first year competing at this level, it was very much a learning experience. They lost their first game, won their second (with Jacob earning a silver medal for earning at least 85 points in a game), and lost their third game. While we

would have loved to see the team go farther, they did a great job in the face of tough competition.

Around all the daily quizzing (which starts at 9 a.m. and continues until 10 p.m.), there were awesome daily afternoon devotions. On Tuesday night, quizzing ends early to allow time for a special service. Quizzers who are ageing out of quizzing (those who are 19 on January 1, 2011) are given the opportunity to say thanks and share what quizzing means to them. Thirty-five young men and women shared their testimonies in one of the most powerful services I have ever attended. From those who were new to church and this was the first and only year to quiz to those who've quizzed for up to 14 years, testimony after testimony spoke of the power of studying God's Word on a daily basis. Several talked about a friend or relative who introduced them to Bible Quizzing and, because of time spent studying God's Word, they learned the truth, came to church, and received the baptism of the Holy Ghost.

The testimony that struck me the most was a young man who had quizzed for several years at the junior level and even made it to Nationals. However, as he reached his teenage years, he got involved in things he shouldn't and eventually stopped attending church altogether. He shared how one day he was sitting in his room sorting through papers on his desk and came across his materials for Junior Quizzing from years ago. With tears in his eyes, he told how God started dealing with him as soon as he picked up those papers, and he broke down sobbing at his desk. He is back in church and, through God's grace, got one more year of quizzing in before he aged out of the program. He credited all those early years of memorizing God's Word as the reason he is back

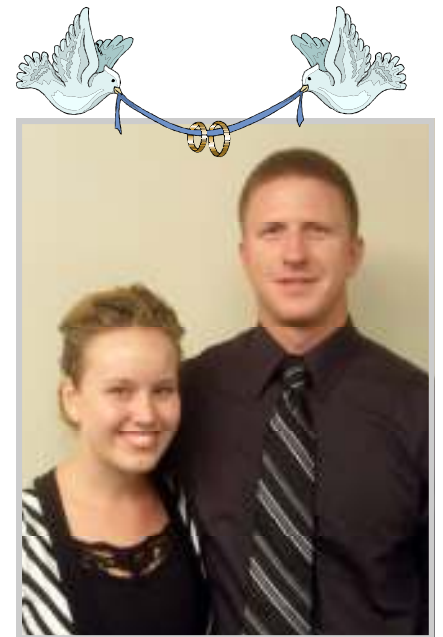
Pee-Wee Bible Quizzing

Your donations are very much appreciated. "Little is much when God is in it."

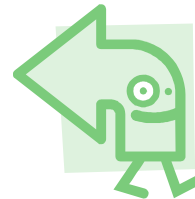
