Pastor Andrew and Heidi Cone

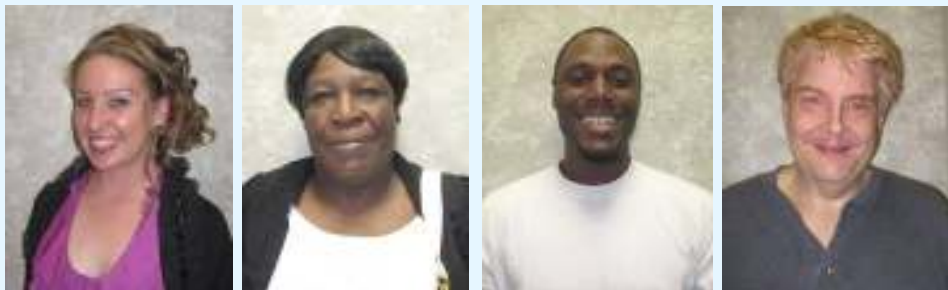

Though she had a careful upbringing, God was not a part of the family’s life. She attended the UW, receiving a BA in Communication with a Dance minor. She moved to Cudahy and became a flight attendant, fulfilling a dream she had since childhood. She had a beautiful apartment near the lake, a nice car, and a great job, but something was definitely missing. She felt an unidentifiable void in her life.

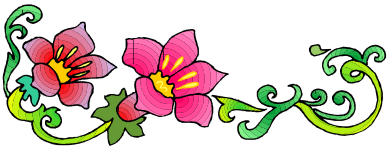
Jessica Atkins has earned a Bachelors in Biology from the University of Wisconsin. She has just accepted a job offer from Covance and will be working as a study technician there.

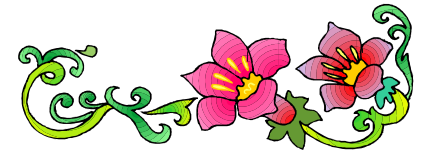

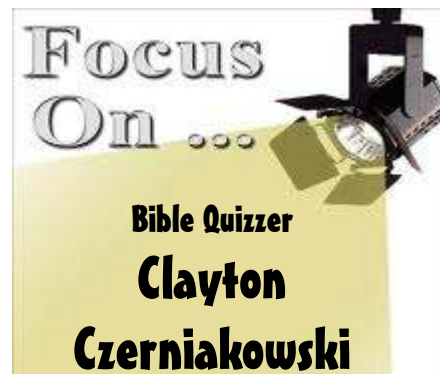

On March 1, 2011, shortly after midnight, my father went into cardiac arrest. He had pain in his shoulder all day, but it was typical of pain he had been having for the past 14 years, and he assumed it would pass as it always had. He took an aspirin for the pain, which may have helped in the big scheme of things. My father was in the living room and my mother in her bedroom when she heard a loud gasp for air and went into the living room to find my father passed out on his rocking chair. My sister, who is trained in CPR, was downstairs. My mother screamed for her, and she managed to skip all the steps, it seemed, and make it to the top. When she saw my dad lying there, lifeless, she grabbed his feet and pulled him to the floor as my mother called 911. She began CPR and within a couple of minutes, the DeForest EMTs had arrived.

They had a defibrillator, thankfully, and began to do their job. Shortly the Sun Prairie paramedics arrived and once got my father's heart beating again, they put him in the ambulance and took him to St. Mary's Hospital. Within a couple of hours, my family was told that he had a 10% chance of making it through this.

Immediately I started praying. Hopeless and unable to do anything about the situation, praying was all I could do. It was in God's hands now. A couple more hours passed, and the doctors said he stabilized, but they left us with little hope that he would make it through the night. At this point, he was on paralytic medication so it would be between twenty-four and forty-eight hours before they would know anything. My family was blessed to have Brother Cone come to the hospital and pray with us. We were also very blessed to have many members of CGC and many other churches as well as family and friends praying for my father's healing.

When they started taking him off the paralytic medicine, they warned us it may be days or even weeks before he woke up, which we were told is normal. Two hours later, he opened his eyes and seemed very confused as to what was going on, of course. Although they wanted him to

come out of the induced coma they didn't want him moving around too much because that could be fatal to his health so they had to give him medication to relax him. At that point, there was a worry of pneumonia, and they continued to warn us that there may be no brain activity or that he wouldn't be the person we knew him to be. Once they established that his brain activity was intact, he was a "presumed survivor."

Although this was good news, they wanted to make sure we were aware of the road ahead and that there was no guarantee he would survive open heart surgery. At that point, they told us he now had a 25%

chance to make it through all of this.

It was at that point I stopped listening to the doctors. I understood it was their job to let us know it wasn't all peaches and cream, but I knew that his life wasn't in their hands and whatever percent they threw out meant nothing. The scariest part was that I didn't know if my father would make it to Heaven and honestly, wasn't even sure I would if it were my life in question. I prayed that he had more time so I could do more to share with him God's word.

My dad continued to get better from that point on. It has been like a movie with a happy ending since then. He was completely "normal" before surgery. They intended on doing an 8-bypass and also found a leaky valve that may need work. On Sunday, I went to church and for the first time believed with all my faith that it was going to be okay. I wasn't scared anymore; I knew I just had to believe. His surgery went perfectly. They only had to do a 5-bypass and thought that his heart, working properly now, would fix the leaky valve on its own. All of the doctors that were involved with him were amazed when they saw him post-surgery.

One doctor said, "I knew your heart before I knew you... it was one of the worst cases I've seen and I never thought I'd have the chance to meet you." My dad was released from the hospital a week later (just two weeks after his initial admission) and his prognosis is great. We were truly blessed and I give all the glory to God. Thank you, JESUS!

Addendum: Today my dad has been cleared not only to drive, but also to go back to work. Shoulder pain from before his heart attack is now totally gone and his attitude about life is completely changed. God has given this man a new lease on life!

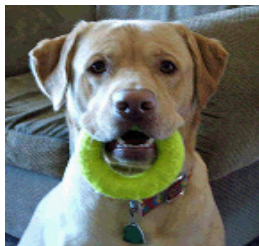

she “wanted to be sure she was doing what the Bible really taught.” Shortly after that prayer, she was in a restaurant talking about God with her roommate, another flight attendant, when another diner came to their table and gave them her testimony. That lady, Dawn Sheedy, from Parkway Apostolic Church, invited them to go along with her to a home friendship group. Heidi went. There, she met the Bro. and Sis. Kerrs and the Paquins from Parkway. Heidi took a home Bible study from Sis. Paquin and found the Bible opening up to her like a hidden treasure. “There were so many amazing new things to learn,” Sis. Heidi says.

Later, Heidi was invited by a fellow flight attendant to a group Bible study given by Bro. Gary Dornback from Parkway Apostolic Church (who has since passed away). Knowing this invitation was from the Lord, she began attending and saw that she needed to be baptized and filled with the Holy Ghost. Despite discouragement from her family, she was baptized on June 21, 1997, at Parkway by Pastor Frank Tamel. About two months later, on Heidi’s 29th birthday, she and her roommate received the Holy Ghost while praying at a group meeting in Dawn Sheedy’s apartment. What a wonderful birthday “gift” that was!

Right away, Heidi got involved in home friendship group leadership, choir, and teaching Sunday school at Parkway. She felt a calling to work with mixed-race children and be a pastor’s wife. The Lord told her she would marry a man raised in Brookfield, Wisconsin. She hoped he would play the guitar.

Andrew had a denominational upbringing but was never excited about going to church! After his father died when Andrew was 14, he felt dazed and confused, and his bent toward getting into trouble snow-

balled down the broad way that leads to destruction. Andrew says, “Things went from bad to worse. Sin is designed to draw us further and further away from the wonderful goodness of God and leave us permanently damaged and undone with no hope of recovery.”

At the age of 32, life’s path had ended up in a dead end. Andrew actually started to pick up a Bible that he had been given 11 years earlier and began to read it from cover to cover. An amazing thing happened as he was reading the second chapter of Acts. The phone rang and it was his sister, Cathy, who had been born again 11 years previously. Bro. Cone was glad it was she, because he had some questions about what he was reading. He said, “I am reading in the book of Acts right now about this Holy Ghost thing. What do I need to do to get it?” Her reply was simply, “The Holy Ghost is a He and not an it, and what you need to do is repent!” His sister took Andrew to Calvary Gospel Church (CGC). Upon entering the church, Andrew could feel God in a way that he never had before. There was joyful, vibrant worship taking place, and people were actually enjoying themselves. The preaching, Andrew says, was “amazingly accessible, easy to understand, and relevant” to his situation. Bro. Keith Mandley looked out into the congregation and seemingly pointed right at Andrew and said, “I know that you have come to receive the Holy Ghost.”

That was all he needed to hear. That was why he had come. He went up to the front, Pastor Thomas laid his hands upon him, and he received the Holy Ghost just as the Bible says! After 20 minutes of speaking in other tongues, Andrew asked them if they baptized as they did in the Bible. The group of men he was questioning looked at him like, “do bears sleep in the woods?” Yes, was the answer and in and under the water he went in Jesus name.

A year after Heidi was baptized, she was given Bro. Andrew Cone’s phone number to call to see if he would teach a Bible study. Heidi remembers, “Bro. Cone said he couldn’t because he had to work. He said, ‘We’ll see you in heaven,’ before we hung up.” Bro. Thomas taught the study and, knowing that Andrew was looking for a wife, made sure Andrew was at the next meeting. When Heidi saw Bro. Cone driving in to the next study, she thought, “That looks like a nice apostolic man. I wonder if that is Andrew Cone.” That same night, Heidi attended service at CGC, and Andrew sought her out after service to talk to her. That day, August 20, 1998, was the beginning of their courtship.

To Heidi’s amazement, she learned that Andrew was raised in Brookfield and he worked a bus route in an area filled with mixed-race children! She also learned that he had recently received his local ministerial license, played guitar, and had a voice that sounded like her pastor, Tony Tamel. She knew he was the one the Lord wanted her to marry.

On February 20, 1999, six months after meeting, the Cones were married at CGC by Pastors John Grant and Anthony Tamel. It was then that they shared their first kiss.

Bro. and Sis. Cone have worked in the bus ministry, hosted home friendship groups, taught Bible studies, and done visitation. Andrew worked at CGC’s Christian school, wrote grant requests for various ministries, and did visitor follow up. While living in Oregon, they began an extension work, holding weekly prayer clinic meetings, which were very well attended. He now works as an Assistant Pastor doing weddings and funerals, jail and hospital visits, overseeing van/bus use and maintenance, sending out new convert cards from Pastor Grant, facilitating the CARE ministry, and keeping track of current needs and prayer requests.
